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




Dairy sheep farming

- A 10,000-year old agricultural activity in the Middle East and the para-Mediterranean countries
- Cyclop Polyphemus mentioned as an early shepherd and cheese-maker (Homer)
- Evolvement of the practice concurrently with rural communities
- Significant role of the practice for the less favoured and remote areas
- Use of lands not suitable for other uses, adding to rural families' income






Dairy sheep farming around Europe

Dairy sheep farming

- China and Turkey are the larger producers of sheep milk worldwide
- Greece is the larger producer in cheese from sheep milk worldwide
- USA is the larger importer of cheese from sheep milk, mainly from Europe
- In the USA, sheep cheese products are primarily niche-products

Problems in dairy sheep farming


- Inadequate education and know-how of farmers
- Decreased productivity, mainly due to increased production cost
- Insufficient linking of crop production to dairy sheep production
- Variations in the quality of the produced milk


Problems in dairy sheep farming

- Social isolation and low social rank of sheep farmers
- Inadequate logistics, networking and search for new markets
- Insufficient R&D and innovation for sheep-milk products and inadequate marketing to reshape consumer habits and opinions
- Lack of targeted strategic planning for development of the sector























- Average milk production per year: 271 L over 180 days
- Average fat content of milk: 6.41%
- Average protein content of milk: 4.67%

- Average total bacterial counts in milk: 3,530,000 cfu mL⁻¹
- Average somatic cell counts in milk: 730,000 cells mL⁻¹

78% of farmers consider mastitis
 as the most important disease



- 72% of farmers have family tradition in agriculture
- Median age of farmers: 46 y
- 10% of farmers have tertiary education degree &
 19% have gone through technical education
- 52% of farmers employ farm staff

Challenges:

recruitment of young people in the sector

imports from Bulgaria & Romania

improvement of productivity

small (0.3%) contribution to the country's GDP in comparison to proportion of people involved (1.1%)
