





(Nielsen et al. 2010)


Misclassification

Attached to leg (Nielsen et al. 2010)
 Walking and standing: ≈ 10%
 Lying: 1.7% (0)

Attached to neck (Martiskainen et al. 2009)
 Walking and standing: 19-29%
 Lying:15%




42 cows (K. Barth, Kiel) 40 cows (Foulum) Sensitivity and specificity ≈ 0.85





Rumination—min/2 hour






Rumination—min/2 hours
