A new look for JDR

The February issue of JDR featured our new "two cows" front cover. You may recognize them from the banner that we use online and in our emails, but now you can see them in all their glory! Also in the last year our publishers, Cambridge University Press, have introduced their new online platform, Cambridge CORE. This is where you find all of the published content of JDR (click here to visit), and soon there will be other features including our own JDR blog. You can create your own online account in CORE to follow JDR or you can find links to recently published articles on our Community website here. oxytocin receptor genes in different species (from Italy and South Africa) and comparisons of milk quality between conventional and robotic milking systems (from Sweden and the Netherlands) and between conventional and organic systems (from Greece). Join the JDR Peer Review Pool

During 2017 we shall introduce a number of measures to speed up time from submission to publication. The first of these is our Peer Review Pool. Our Community now numbers more than 1000 members from all around the globe, and we hope that most of you will join the Pool. This will allow us to quickly find suitable referees for papers. It is in everyone's interests to article turnaround time, so please help! You can apply to join the Peer Review Pool here

Hybrid Peer Review

Once our Peer Review pool is established we shall be able to introduce a Hybrid Peer Review process. If the normal Commissioned Peer Review (where referees are chosen by our EBM) does not produce a decision within six weeks from submission, authors will have the option for their title to appear online for Community Peer Review. Members of the Peer Review Pool will be able to volunteer to referee (respecting the normal values of competence, impartiality and confidentiality). We shall run a trial of this part of the process for selected manuscripts commencing May 1st, so please watch out for that and be prepared to help with the refereeing.

We have now published four futuristic review articles:

- Genetically engineering milk
- Engineering to support wellbeing of dairy animals
- Novel trends in engineered milk products
- Functional and technological properties of camel milk proteins

Our Reviews can only be submitted by invitation, but if you have an idea for a Prospective Review, please get in touch. Who knows, we may invite you to prepare and submit that idea!
