

JDR Policy: To ensure that we can publish as much high quality research as possible, we have a strict policy of encouraging shorter, concise articles that are highly relevant to our scope and that are likely to have significant international impact. We have two formats: **Full Papers** report hypothesis led research, in other words, a hypothesis must be presented and tested and the conclusions must clearly indicate whether or not the hypothesis was supported by the experimental results. **Research Communications** are of equal scientific merit and report high-quality hypothesis-led or descriptive research in a way that focuses attention on the novel findings. This is our preferred category for most research. For both types of article we strongly encourage the use of a Supplementary File to provide supporting information such as non-essential data and detailed methodologies. This file can be of any length and is published online linked to the main article. Providing a Supplementary File ensures that the main article is as concise as possible.
