Objective

The present study aims to understand the difficulties encountered by French dairy farmers and/or cheesemakers and their perspectives.


Methodology

Investigation was carried out from July 16 to August 11, 2023 in Aveyron in the Midi-Pyrenees region, South West France and in Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes region, South-Eastern France.

• Twenty French dairy farmers and/or cheesemakers were interviewed face to face.

Statistical analysis

- Mean ± SD or frequencies of the different variables are calculated
- SPSS package program, version 20
- Interpretation and analysis the data.

Employees number and age of farmers and cheesemakers (Mean ± SD)



More than half (55%) of the the visited farms and cheese factories

There is a female predominance among the staff (≥50%).



Problems encountered in work

85%: An excessive workload

65%: Few vacations/per year

The women farmers and/or cheesemakers declared:

- ✓ They have difficulty taking care of their babies.
- ✓ They cannot accompany their children to school.
- ✓ The children do not even have vacations.

44% of dairy farmers

 Price of milk is not sufficient in relation to the efforts made and the financial costs of the farms

20% of dairy farmers and cheesemakers

 European hygiene standards and bureaucratic burdens

20% of dairy farmers and cheesemakers

 Lack of qualified employees

Animal diseases rare

 More than half (56%) of the farms visited

Anxiety

- About urbanization (19%)
- Presence of wolves in the region (6%)

Lack of consideration of farmers' work

- One third of farmers (31%) declared:
- Their work is not considered by some agricultural managers
- They are always criticized by environmental defenders

During covid 19 pandemic

During confinement



33 % of dairy farms and cheesemakers found some difficulties:

- Isolation
- Imposing health prevention for employees
- A large stock of cheeses in the cellars

67% continued to work without any problems

After confinement



- All the cheesemakers (100%) declared that they have a better sale of cheese and exhaustion of all the stock never seen until now.
- People avoid going to supermarkets and they have settled in the companions during this period and buy directly from the farms or cheese factories

Perspectives

- 30% → reduction in workload (delegating other people to the making and selling of cheeses or automating the farm).
- 70%
 → wish the stability in production and not invest to expand farms or cheese factories, while 30 % want to diversify in production (transforming all of the farm's milk into cheeses and yogurt, developing agricultural tourism...).
- 30% → expressed their wish that one of their children take over the farm and/or the cheese factory.

Conclusion

Agriculture managers must find a strategy to reduce the workload of farmers and/or cheesemakers, increase their remuneration and/or offer financial assistance.

Also, environmental defenders must stop harassing dairy farmers as they are contributing to food security in the world and offer us a tasty cheese.
